



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Letter from OUR CMO

In medicine, the most important thing we can do is listen.

This past year, more than ever, I found myself listening—not just to patients, but to providers on the front lines of care. They shared their experiences, both heartwarming and harrowing. They told us what was working. They told us what wasn't. We listened, and in 2024, we began implementing changes.

In response, we focused on removing barriers for patients trying to access services and for the medical professionals doing their best to deliver them. We implemented tools that make care more seamless, like Al-driven charting, self-scheduling, and workflow optimizations in urgent care. We expanded specialty services to meet growing demand. And because the people doing the work every day often have the clearest view of what's needed, we launched programs grounded in provider insight.

I'm especially proud of the way our team embraced new technology as a way to make care more human. By reducing documentation time and improving access, we've allowed our providers to do what they do best: focus on the patient in front of them. That is the true power of care-being fully present, fully equipped, and fully supported.

At the same time, our community's needs continue to evolve. We saw significant growth in demand for urgent care, mobile care, and school-based care. We met those needs with compassion and speed. We adapted. We stepped up, and we never lost sight of the reason we're here.

Looking ahead, I remain hopeful—not just for the return of hospital-based resources to our region, but for the continued momentum we've built in access, innovation, and collaboration. Our care model is stronger because our people are stronger, and the future of healthcare in this Valley is brighter than ever because it's being shaped by those who live and serve here every day.

Financing the Fiture Los Banos Expansion Enables Better Care

In 2024, Camarena Health unlocked a new level of impact through the New Market Tax Credit (NMTC) program—a strategic financial tool designed to drive investment in underserved communities. For the first time in its history, Camarena Health leveraged this powerful funding mechanism to accelerate the development of its Los Banos facility, sourcing \$24.5 million in NMTC allocations towards the project.

What could have taken years to finance was brought to life in under 12 months. But the impact went far beyond construction speed: the project generated local jobs, ensured living-wage employment opportunities, and laid the groundwork for expanded access to healthcare in a region that needs it most. As CEO Paulo Soares explains, "Securing NMTC funding was a critical milestone in our mission to expand healthcare access. This investment not only accelerated the development of our Los Banos facility but also delivered economic and health benefits to an underserved region."

Care That Comes to lass

When a Chowchilla school administrator reached out with an idea, Camarena Health responded with action. In 2024, a new mobile clinic partnership was launched at Chowchilla Union High School, providing essential healthcare directly to students, staff, and the broader community. The program, made possible through a school-secured grant, quickly became a model for barrier-free, student-centered care.

Full-day clinics operated every other week during the school year, providing medical services while working closely with school staff to support students and families. Services included required health screenings such as Tdap vaccines, TB tests, annual and sports physicals, and general primary care. By partnering with Chowchilla High School, Camarena Health improved healthcare access, reduced student absenteeism, and minimized the need for parents to miss work—all while strengthening community trust. The program has since expanded, now welcoming students and families from all Chowchilla schools to visit the mobile health unit during the school day at Chowchilla High.


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NEW SITES, SAME Commitment

A New Era of Walk-in Care in Chowchilla

In March 2024, Camarena Health celebrated the opening of its newest urgent care center in the heart of Chowchilla. The 9,000-square-foot facility was introduced with a ribbon-cutting ceremony, tours, and strong community support—a reflection of the organization's twodecade presence in the area.

Located just off Hospital Drive, the center provides walk-in access for urgent care services and is designed to grow with the needs of the community. "This new location allows us to bring much-needed urgent care services to residents while continuing to meet the healthcare needs of the community for many years to come," said CEO Paulo Soares.





Expanding Access in Fresno Through Partnership

In July 2024, Camarena Health expanded its presence into Fresno with the opening of a new urgent care facility on the campus of Saint Agnes Medical Center. Through a strategic transition of ownership and operations, Camarena Health assumed management of the Saint Agnes Main Campus Urgent Care, bringing its patient-first model to a broader population in Fresno County.

The new site is now open seven days a week. "This transition furthers our commitment to delivering quality care and making a meaningful impact on the health and wellness of more individuals in our community," said CEO Paulo Soares. This partnership marks a new chapter in Camarena Health's mission to provide accessible, high-quality urgent care to all.







Closing the Gap Prenatal Care That Saves Lives

Camarena Health developed its own in-house Gestational Diabetes Program—delivering early detection and personalized care throughout pregnancy. Beyond addressing an immediate care gap, it raised the standard of care promoting long-term wellness and helping to reduce health disparities across the community.

Led by Soledad Reyes and an integrated care team, the program is reducing birth complications, preventing emergency C-sections and tackling unspoken social factors that influence prenatal health. Expectant mothers enrolled in the program receive comprehensive support, including screening and diagnosis, medication and dietary management, health education, behavioral health services, ongoing monitoring, and postpartum follow-up.

Growing Talent From Within

Celebrating Camarena Health's First Graduating Class of Clinical Medical Assistants

In 2024, Camarena Health launched its first in-house Clinical Medical Assistant training program—a 12-week, grant-funded initiative developed in partnership with Central Valley Health Network and Jewish Vocational Service.

Ten frontline team members gained new clinical skills while continuing to serve patients. Designed to ease the burden of balancing work and school, the program brought education directly into the workplace—removing barriers and building career pathways from within.

With additional support from the Madera County Workforce Assistance Center's Incumbent Worker Program, participants were even paid during clinical training.

Each graduate took a meaningful step forward in their career and helped set a powerful example for what's possible when an organization invests in its people.



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Resilience in Action Julie's Journey

From front desk to clinician, Julie Juarez's story is a powerful example of resilience in motion. A teen mom juggling school, work, and parenthood, she learned early how to fight for her future. She joined Camarena Health in 2011—and she never stopped moving forward.

Over the next decade, Julie became a health educator, a program coordinator, and assistant to Chief Medical Officer Dr. Joel Ramirez. All the while, she held onto a bigger dream: becoming a licensed clinician to help others facing complex life challenges.

Determined to make it happen, Julie enrolled in a Master of Social Work program, completing coursework and clinical hours at Camarena Health while working full time. The days were long—often 12 hours—but she found support in leaders like Dr. Ramirez and Behavioral Health Director Rosalba Serrano Rivera, who helped guide her journey.

In 2025, Julie will officially step into her new role as a behavioral health clinician. For her, it's more than a job—it's a way to give back to the community that shaped her, and show her children what perseverance can become.

Freeing Providers to Focus on What Matters Most

In 2024, Camarena Health introduced a game-changing solution to one of modern medicine's most pervasive pain points: documentation. With the rollout of our Al-powered scribe tool, providers gained back the time and clarity they needed to reconnect with the core of their calling—caring for patients.

The scribe tool operates quietly in the background during patient visits, capturing the conversation and generating a complete clinical note in under 90 seconds. What began as a pilot with three medical providers quickly scaled. Today, more than 43 providers—over half of Camarena Health's clinical team—have integrated this tool into their daily workflow.

Immediate Impact:

- Providers saved four to six hours a day on documentation
- Accuracy of notes and timeliness improved across departments
- Burnout levels dropped as clinicians reconnected with patient care

More than a convenience, the scribe tool is a reflection of Camarena Health's evolving approach to care—where technology enhances the provider experience, so every patient benefits.

More Than a Clinic Wellness in Motion

At Camarena Health, wellness goes beyond appointments. It's about creating everyday opportunities to move, recharge, and connect. In 2024, movement-based programming grew from Tesoro Viejo to new locations, thanks to team members like Cristina Rendon and Dr. Carolina Gutierrez Garcia. Yoga, pilates, and gym circuit classes opened to patients and the public, welcoming participants of all fitness levels.

When space was limited, the team got inventive, transforming the waiting room at Chowchilla North into a yoga studio during shift changes. The goal wasn't a new building—it was a new mindset.

With each class, Camarena Health is making wellness accessible, adaptable, and rooted in community.

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Care Without Expectation Giving Back, Heart First

Throughout 2024, Camarena Health's mission extended well beyond clinic walls as staff across the organization took part in a series of special community service events, aimed at meeting people with compassion where they are, especially during the moments that matter most.

From packing Thanksgiving dinners with the Madera County Food Bank, to partnering with Assemblywoman Esmeralda Soria's office to distribute turkeys in Madera and Chowchilla, staff showed up with full hearts and open hands. But it was the Christmas care packs for local seniors that left the deepest mark.

Instead of focusing solely on children or unhoused populations, we chose to center our efforts around seniors—often overlooked during the holidays—in Madera, Los Banos, and Chowchilla. Staff thoughtfully curated gift bags filled with practical items, not promotional swag, and hand-delivered them with sincerity and warmth.

"Why would you do this for us?" one senior asked. "For no other reason than we care," a team member replied.

The gesture resonated deeply—with recipients and with the teams involved. As one staff member put it, "Truly caring is when you do something with no expectation of reciprocation. It's the smile you bring them and the happiness you make them feel, that's what makes this job worth it."


